## Purpose of Group:

Monitor or coordinate monitoring (changes) in:

- Social understanding/perspectives
- Treatment effects
- Landscape components and patterns

# **Goals and Objectives:**

- Develop key monitoring questions and ways to answer them
- Collect and share information on the social, treatment effects and landscape monitoring in time and space
- Recommend any needed changes to ongoing efforts by the ODRC

## What we are going to do:

# 1. ANSWER MONITORING QUESTIONS (HIGH PRIORITY):

- a. Social
  - i. Questions:
    - 1. Are education and outreach efforts working?
    - 2. What are public perceptions/knowledge of dunes work?
  - ii. Methods:
    - 1. Questionnaires
    - 2. Polls
    - 3. Surveys
    - 4. Stories
    - 5. Use field rangers
- b. Treatment
  - i. Questions:
    - 1. What are the native and/or invasive plant response?
    - 2. How effective was the treatment in reaching the goal?
    - 3. How did treatment affect wildlife use? How did it impact?
    - 4. What treatments are most effective to remove invasives/increase open sand/increase native species?
  - ii. Methods:
    - **1.** Transects
    - 2. Photo points
    - 3. Plots

<sup>\*</sup>Note: Treatment monitoring should be done in partnership with USFS restoration implementation to ensure pre and post-treatment information is gathered at the right time.

#### c. Landscape—

## i. Questions:

- 1. How is the landscape changing without any treatments?
- 2. How is the landscape changing with treatments?
- 3. What's changing the fastest?
- 4. What's most at risk?
- 5. What are the dunes ecosystem elements (e.g. dunes, invasive communities, native grass/herb/shrub/forest communities)? These would form the change analysis components for the above questions
- 6. How quickly are areas changing over time? foredune/deflation plain/inland sand?

#### ii. Methods:

- 1. Remote sensing
- 2. Change detection—gis
- 3. Photo points
- 4. Transects
- 2. USE EXISTING MONITORING DATA—COMPILE AND SHARE LESSONS LEARNED (HIGH PRIORITY)
- 3. DEVELOP PROTOCOL—SHARE WITH COLLABORATIVE AND INVOLVE PUBLIC (HIGH PRIORITY)
- 4. PROVIDE MONITORING ACCOUNTABILITY; DEVELOP ADAPTIVE MANAGEMENT OPPORTUNITIES
- 5. **5 YEAR REPORT** 
  - a. Inform outreach/funding/treatment efforts
  - b. Platform for internal/external communication

#### What we Need from Other Work Groups

- Education—help spread information; help with social monitoring
- Outreach—help with social monitoring
- Funding—money to accomplish monitoring and reports
