Working Group Updates

Communications & Outreach - We had a booth again this year at the Florence Home & Garden Show, where we spoke to many community members about our work. It was the first event we were at since learning about our Publication of the Year Award! Our communications group is now busy with press releases and promoting the book and our upcoming spring events.

We are also looking at making minor changes to our brochures and ordering a second printing of our outreach materials for this year.

Volunteering - We held another gorse work party at Heceta Dunes on March 9th. The weather was bright and sunny, and our volunteers continued removing the large, blooming gorse from our project area in Heceta Dunes.

Our next work party will be held on March 29th or 30th, at the Waxmyrtle Campground. As always, visit [our website](#) for upcoming events and to sign up for our volunteer email.

Education - We have several upcoming ways to learn more about the dunes this spring. First is a science pub talk at 7 Devils Brewing Co. in Coos Bay. It will be held at 4PM on Sunday, April 7th. Other volunteers will be at Earth Day events in Old Town Florence. Look for our table, ask them questions, or pick up a copy of "Restoring Oregon's Dunes."

Then in June, the dunes are the featured topic at the Coos History Museum "First Tuesday Talks" series at 6:30PM. Museum admission required. More information is available on the [museum's website](#).

Monitoring - The Monitoring Group will be coordinating with the other working groups this spring to determine how we can start monitoring our progress. We'll be starting to more thoroughly document our volunteer work parties to measure changes in vegetation at specific sites. We have also connected with a photographer who is planning on taking an aerial flight over the dunes this spring, so we are excited for some updated aerial photos of the dunes!

Funding - The funding group is seeking grants to fund our work throughout 2019 and beyond. We are currently putting together an application to private foundations to fund a second year of our RARE intern and various other projects. Our group is also looking into requesting federal funds for large-scale dune restoration and is learning how the Congressional appropriations process works.

Cooperative Weed Management Area (CWMA) - The Oregon Dunes CWMA and USFS botanist Armand Rebeschke will present "Invasive Weeds on Our Dunes!" on May 2nd at the Siuslaw Public Library in Florence at 4:00 PM. The talk will cover dunes ecology and identification of invasive weeds.

Did you Know? - Snowy Plover Nesting Season

Did you know that nesting season for Snowy Plover starts this month? These adorable little birds lay their eggs in open sand between March and September. Certain areas of the beaches and dunes are closed beginning on March 15. Please follow all posted signs and regulations to avoid disturbing these birds and their nests.
